HOW TO ENTER

IT'S AS EASY AS 1 -2-3!

STEP 1: Purchase your ride at https://virtualhorsesport.com/product/alohadressage-online-dressage-schooling-shows/

You will receive an email with a link to your entry form. (HOLD until Step 3)

If you plan on submitting videos for different tests, you need to purchase one ride for each test.

STEP 2: Record your test

Filming your test does not need to be with a fancy video camera. The best way to film your ride is with your mobile phone! Check the competition rules here: https://virtualhorsesport.com/the-rules/

- 1. Have a friend stand at or near the letter C. The test may be videoed from Letters C, F or E, with the sun at your back. C is best.
- 2. When filming make sure the lighting is good and the film clear. Stand with sun IN BACK OF YOU
- 3. Position your phone in landscape



STEP 3: Fill Out Your Entry and Upload Your Video BY JULY 24th

- Click on the entry form in your email. This will take you to your online form
- Fill out the entry form with your name, horse name, test and other fields there.
- Upload your video. There are 3 different options:
 - 1. UPLOAD YOUR VIDEO TO YouTube.com directly from your phone and copy the link.
 - 2. Upload to the server directly within the entry form (May take 30 minutes depending on internet speed)
 - 3. In the entry form, Click on the Virtual Horse Sport Google Drive & drop and drag your video into the drop box.
- Click the "SEND ENTRY"

YOU ARE DONE!

You now wait for the judge to review your test. You will be notified by email when you test has been judged and placed. That is when you log into your account and see your test results under "Your Show Entries Results"

Classic Dressage Virtual Competition Rules:

- 1. All uploaded videos must not have been previously reviewed by other licensed judges and CANNOT be from past or present licensed shows.
- 2. Videos of tests must be unedited from start to finish.
- 3. After entering the arena, prior to beginning the test a sign must be held up showing the name of the show, date of the show, horse's name, rider's name and test being ridden. Remove the sign just before beginning the ride.
- 4. The test may be videoed from Letters C, F or E, with the sun at your back. C is best.
- 5. The test may be called.
- 6. Coaching during the test is NOT allowed.
- 7. The natural background sound for the test must be audible.
- 8. If the judge determines that the horse appears lame or off, the judge has the discretionary right to excuse the ride and not continue scoring. Judge will make notes on the score sheet indicating their observations. The Judge's decision is final.
- 9. If the rider/trainer notices the horse is off or lame, PRIOR to submitting the video, a deferment will be given to another show. The rider must contact the Show Office BEFORE the last day of the competition. The horse's welfare and health must be the first priority.
- 10. There is no dress code, however clothing should be modest in presentation and functional.
- 11. No draw reins will be allowed.
- 12. Boots and wraps are allowed.

WDAA Virtual Competition Rules

- 1. All uploaded videos must not have been previously reviewed by other licensed judges, past or present licensed shows.
- 2. Videos of tests must be unedited from start to finish. The video must be one continuous recording of photo-centric images.
- 3. Video must be clean. Overlays of text, graphics or other non-photo based images, are not allowed.
- 4. After entering the arena, prior to beginning the test a sign must be held up showing the name of the show, date of the show and horse's name. The sign must be held in the top right corner of the frame so it will not interfere with the view of the center line for the judge. Remove the sign just before beginning the ride.
- 5. Ridden tests may be submitted to ONLY ONE online show. A video of a test/ride from another competition that has already been judged must be eliminated. Any video suspected of having been filmed during another competition will not be scored.
- 6. As soon as the test is finished, the camera must circle the horse and rider showing equipment and attire.
- 7. Following equipment check, the rider will dismount, in front of the camera and drop the bit of the horse so it can be recorded.
- 8. Bridle or saddle pad numbers are not allowed.
- 9. The test must be videoed from C, where the judge would normally be seated.
- 10. The test may be called.
- 11. Coaching during the test is not allowed.
- 12. The natural background sound for the test must be audible. Tests with no sound at all will not be accepted.
- 13. If the judge determines that the horse appears lame or off, the judge has the discretionary right to excuse the ride and not continue scoring. Judge will make notes on the score sheet indicating their observations. The Judge's decision is final.

- 14. If the rider notices the horse is off or lame, prior to submitting the video, a deferment will be given to another show. The rider must contact the Show Office PRIOR to the last day of the competition. The horse's welfare and health must be the first priority.
- 15. Violation of any of these rules may result in the refusal to accept the entry or non-refundable scratch.
- 16. There is no dress code, however clothing should be modest in presentation and functional.
